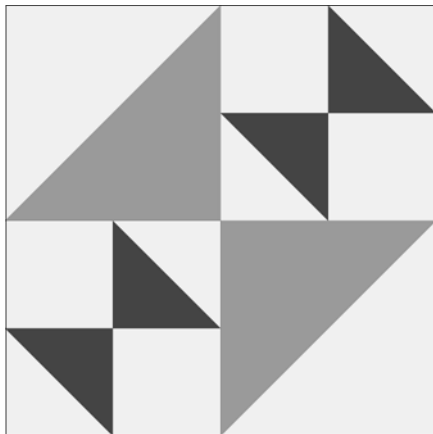


BIBLE STUDIES PATTERN SERIES

24 Jeremiah (Crosses & Losses)



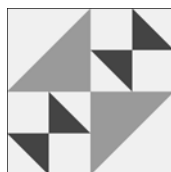
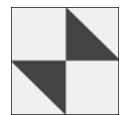
Pattern for 6" finished block — All seams are 1/4".
Pressing directions are indicated.

Fabric needed for one block & Cutting instructions		
Dark	1/8 yard or scrap (2) 2-3/8" squares, cut once diagonally	
Medium	1/8 yard or scrap (1) 3-7/8" squares, cut once diagonally	
Light	1/8 yard or scrap (1) 3-7/8" squares, cut once diagonally	
	(2) 2-3/8" squares, cut once diagonally (4) 2" squares	



Instructions:

1. Create the large half-squares by stitching Medium to large Light triangles along the long side. Press seams toward the Medium triangles. Make (2) units.
2. Create the small half-squares by stitching Dark triangles to small Light triangles along the long side. Press seams toward the Dark triangles. Make (4) units.
3. Create the four-square units by stitching Light squares to the right of the Dark/Light half-squares as shown. Press toward the Light square. Stitch (2) units together to form the four-square. Press seam open. Make (2) units.
4. Stitch the units from Step 3 to the left side of the large half-square units from Step 1. Press toward the large half-square.
5. Complete the block by stitching the two units together. Press seam open.



While the prophet Jeremiah was banished by King Solomon, he dictated a collection of prophecies aimed at Judah and Jerusalem. Jeremiah often dictated his prophecies to his aide, Baruch. The book of Jeremiah also contains Baruch's memoirs.

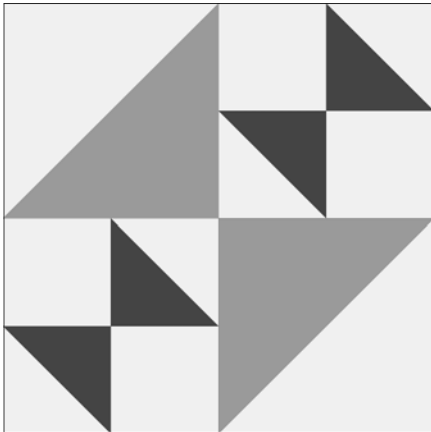

24 Jeremiah (Crosses & Losses)



This is Block 24 of a 73 block series representing the 39 books of the Old Testament, 7 books of the Apocrypha, and 27 books of the New Testament. I chose to name the blocks after books of the Bible as a testament to my faith. I call the finished quilt "Bible Studies." Whether Catholic or Protestant, I hope each block will have a special meaning to the quilt maker. For me, reviewing the books of the Bible recalled many of my favorite bible stories and passages. I include a bit of Bible history for each block. I have used, as a reference, the New Oxford Annotated Bible with the Apocrypha, Revised Standard Version, 1977, an Ecumenical Study Bible.

I chose Crosses & Losses to represent the book of Jeremiah because Jeremiah is very concerned with rewards & punishments. He assures readers that good and evil will be justly rewarded, and he admonishes Judeans for worshipping gods other than the Lord.
